- Descriptive Title (not just "Volunteer!")
- Position Overview and Impact (does it make a difference?)
- Key Responsibilities
- Qualifications
- Training and Support Provided
- Benefits of Volunteering
- Time & Length of Commitment
- Staff Connection/Collaborator



Volunteer Computer Coach

Position Overview and Impact: Change a Life! Share your computer skills with novice computer users. As the world becomes more wired and the economy demands computer knowledge, many people are learning to use a computer for the first time. Be part of a team that is helping to bridge the digital divide in our community.

Key Responsibilities:

- Sign up for at least one 2 hour shift per week.
- Be available to respond to requests from patrons as needed. Assist users one-onone with such tasks as: logging on to the computers, MS Office, printing, resume formatting, Internet searching and e-mail.
- Troubleshoot minor computer and printer problems.
- Identify any additional "Commonly Asked Questions" and share with staff and othe coaches. Consult reference librarians as needed.

Position Overview:	Lead a team of dedicated volunteers at the Santa Teresa Branch Librar coordinate Winner's Circle, a cooperative homework club.	
Responsibilities:	 Coordinate with the Scheduler to develop a weekly schedule of volunteers Work with Resource Manager and library staff to develop necessary registration forms, sign-in sheets and publicity materials Ensure that appropriate records on the program are kept Maintain administrative handbook Conduct outreach to local schools and parent groups to recruit volunteers and participants Screen and interview Scholastic Supervisors and Homework Coaches to run Winner's Circle Provide initial training and ongoing support for volunteers

Library Arts Program media/PR Liaison

Position Overview and Impact: Did you know your library is a cultural hub and place for art appreciation, artistic expression and discovery in the community? Help the library by coordinating the distribution of promotional materials and information about programs in services that will inform individuals in the community of the Library Community Arts Initiative and related programs.

Key Responsibilities:

- Work with appropriate library staff and/or volunteers to create copy for program flyers, newsletters, press releases and other marketing items.
- Identify, track and meet deadlines for providing copy to local media outlets.
- Identify new ways and places to post information either electronically or in physical format. Make contacts with media outlets as appropriate to learn of marketing opportunities.
- Track deadlines for submitting program information to various media and online outlets. Post information as it is made available.
- Coordinate distribution of print materials throughout the community.

Qualifications:

- Organizational skills for the purposes of coordinating distribution of information while meeting deadlines and format requirements of various media outlets.
- Ability to use and search the Internet. Comfort level with online forms.
- Good communication skills, particularly in writing.
