Alia Shields: Yes, love Endless Alphabet! Catherine O'Hara: Define "curation" tool

Jaime Gotlieb:Little Writer is being used in Doug. Co. before storytime starts

Eileen O'Shea:but we'll ask Cen and Genesis to create a webliography too.

Jaime Gotlieb: Thanks, Lisa! I have a source you know:)

Wendy Wright: It's amazing how many kids don't recognize the real animal sounds.

Shelley Quezada: Is that Watertown MA?

Wendy Wright: One corrected me with "No, pigs say OINK!"

James Donaldson: What was the name of the library system pioneering Take-home iPads?

Jennifer Hall:Sorry if this was just shared - I was briefly interrupted. You can also use 'guided access' in an iPad settings to passcode lock the screen so they can't change apps.

Tiffany Paisley: Complaining! LOL

Emily Wray: We have yet to offer take-home tablets; however, we have in-house iPads with loaded apps for young people to explore. Also, we run our iPads through a projector to a screen for interaction

Mary Kuehner: Darien Library

Emily Wray: Yes, Jennifer, we "lock down" our iPads so apps are secure, and it works

Thomas Vose: You apparently adore alliteration in all avenues of academia.

Marisa Conner:Baltimore County Public Library in Maryland

Jaime Gotlieb:We can't ignore what people are doing and preach against it. We should be here to support them

Marie Plug:For those of you who in-house iPADS with loaded apps...how many do you have and did you obtain grant money to purchase them?

Marcia Melkonian: from Los Angeles Unified School District

Jeanette Heath: We have tech classes that are one on one and in group sessions to help teach new products that we have or would be of interest to our patrons.

Marie Plug:Sorry...I meant have in-house iPADS...:)

Thomas Vose:Content creation seems vital. We don't want to be overly subject to the whims of publishers, like we are with ebooks.

Wendy Wright:In a large sense, this is about remaining relevant and user-focused. Our customers are using this technology, and need our expertise.

Jeanette Heath:Grant for the nook.

Mary Kuehner:Yes, Jaime. We need to meet our patrons where they are - we are no longer the gatekeepers, deciding FOR our patrons how they will get their information.

Linn Browning: Question for those with circulating iPads: how are they holding up? Are they coming back damaged or malfunctioning?

Emily Wray: We have 6 iPads and grant money was a large factor.

Amanda Foulk: The ipads themselves and mounts were installed as part of a remodel, and our Friends of the Library have supported app purchases with iPad gift cards.

Melissa Harrah: We are submitting a grant request to tie in a story using math skills that will be adapted by professional app makers.

Jennifer Hall:Ditto to Amanda's comment - grant from our Friends and local Rotary Club, too, for the iPads and the apps.

Amanda Foulk: We're able to use one logon for all our iPads, and that allows us to purchase the app once and install it on all the devices.

Thomas Vose: Arudino programming as well...

Thomas Vose:D'oh - "Arduino."

Emily Wray: As a small library that is part of a five-library district, we have found various means for keeping the devices safe. Delta has theirs locked down with cables, I believe, but our smaller library hasn't had that need.

Jane Cronkhite: any concerns about ADA compliance?

Marie Plug: Thank you! Do you allow children to sign up for a certain time frame to use the iPADS or is it first come first serve?

Wendy Wright: Agreed, Mary.

Emily Wray: Yes, we purchase once and then plug in to a sync port

Jane Cronkhite:we're going with Ipads because of ADA

Jennifer Hall:@Marie: wall-mounted, first come, first served

Amanda Foulk: Ours have been first come, first serve (just like our early literacy computer stations)

Shelley Quezada: At present only IOS devices are considerd accessible, I believe.

Amanda Foulk: We let caregivers and attention spans limit the length of a turn

Emily Wray: We allow children to check out iPads for an hour timeframe and it is first come...

Thomas Vose: How many of you have had problems with loss or theft? Were you able to recover them?

Wendy Wright: Thomas, your question came up recently on the PubLib listserv, and no-one had problems.

Deborah McCoy: We have three Ipads, a nook, Kindle, kindle Fire and allow checkouts in the library on an as available basis. no time limits.

Thomas Vose: I ask because we did.

Emily Wray: Our district has had one loss and one recovery, re: iPads stolen

Marie Plug:I am amazed at the number of you who actually make this technology accessible to children. This gives me hope that it's possible. Did you run into resistance from some library staff and, if so, how did you overcome this?

Linn Browning: Thomas: I was asking something similar because our library's record with books is bad enough. I kind of cringe to think how badly circulating iPads might be treated.

Jane Cronkhite:emily wray, what library are you with?

Marie Plug:By the way, we have this technology available to adults, but children are overlooked in this area.

Emily Wray:My library staff is very open to forward movement, so no reluctance here. As the speaker said, this is not replacement of traditional storytime implements, but enhancement!

Gail Yerbic:We put ours in Life Cases to prevent damage from impact or liquid—better for children.

Emily Wray: Jane, I'm at Cedaredge Library in the Delta County Library District in Western CO

Jane Cronkhite:we're planning 1 hr check outs too, that's why i ask:)

Emily Wray: Where do you hail from, Jane?

Michelle Turnis: how do make sure they can only access the apps you have loaded on an iPad?

Jane Cronkhite:Los Altos CA, Santa Clara County Library

Thomas Vose: Michelle - You can lock access to iTunes behind a password.

Angelica Sauceda: I do bilingual storytime....is their anything out there for Spanish apps?

Emily Wray: Amanda Foulk mentioned that they allow caregivers and attention spans to dictate, and even though we set an hour time limit, we are maleable too=)

Michelle Turnis: Thank you Thomas.

Michelle Turnis: Can you lock what programs they can access on the iPad?

Beth Crist:And check out Storyblocks! Short vids of librarians demonstrating rhymes & songs for parents, librarians, ECE educators. http://www.storyblocks.org/

Beth Crist: Storyblocks isn't an app yet but we're hopeful we can do that soon

Jane Cronkhite: We're thinking 1 hr attention span and media use as well

Thomas Vose: Yes, to a certain degree - the parental controls are actually pretty good.

Eileen O'Shea:good step by step instrutions for locking the ipad:

Jeanette Heath: How do you keep the parents envolved. Mine like to just drop off the kiddos and then take off somewhere else in the library?

Jennifer Hall:@Michelle - that's where the 'guided access' setting on the iPad allows you to set it to a single app that no one w/o the password can change. We make it 'app of the day' with a different app per iPad so there is a variety.

Mary Kuehner: Thanks, Beth! We're adding new videos this week! 4 more in Spanish and 6 more in English!

Michelle Turnis: Thanks eveyone, I will have to play a bit more with ours and find all these features.

Jennifer Hall:Guided access is an Accessibility setting under General settings

Melanie Tucker: What about issues on copyright?

Jane Cronkhite:i would love to get in touch with anyone already loaning ipads, we're just piloting it. (ipads arrived today!)

Amanda Foulk:@Jeanette cushions/stools instead of chairs. A computer with a single child-sized chair discourages parent engagement, but I've seen parents sit on our cushions to play with their child on the wall-mounted ipads.

Eileen O'Shea:if you all want to stay in touch, plug your email into the text chat and you can check them out via the saved text chat.
